- Chairs

- Empty medicine bottles




**Paper & Cardboard**

- Non-metallic gift wrap
- Greeting cards
- Books
- Magazines and catalogs
- Bags
- Boxes, e.g., cereal, packing
- Computer printouts
- Junk mail
- Milk and juice cartons
- Newspapers

\* Please put ALL plastic bags into one plastic bag then put it in your recycling container.
