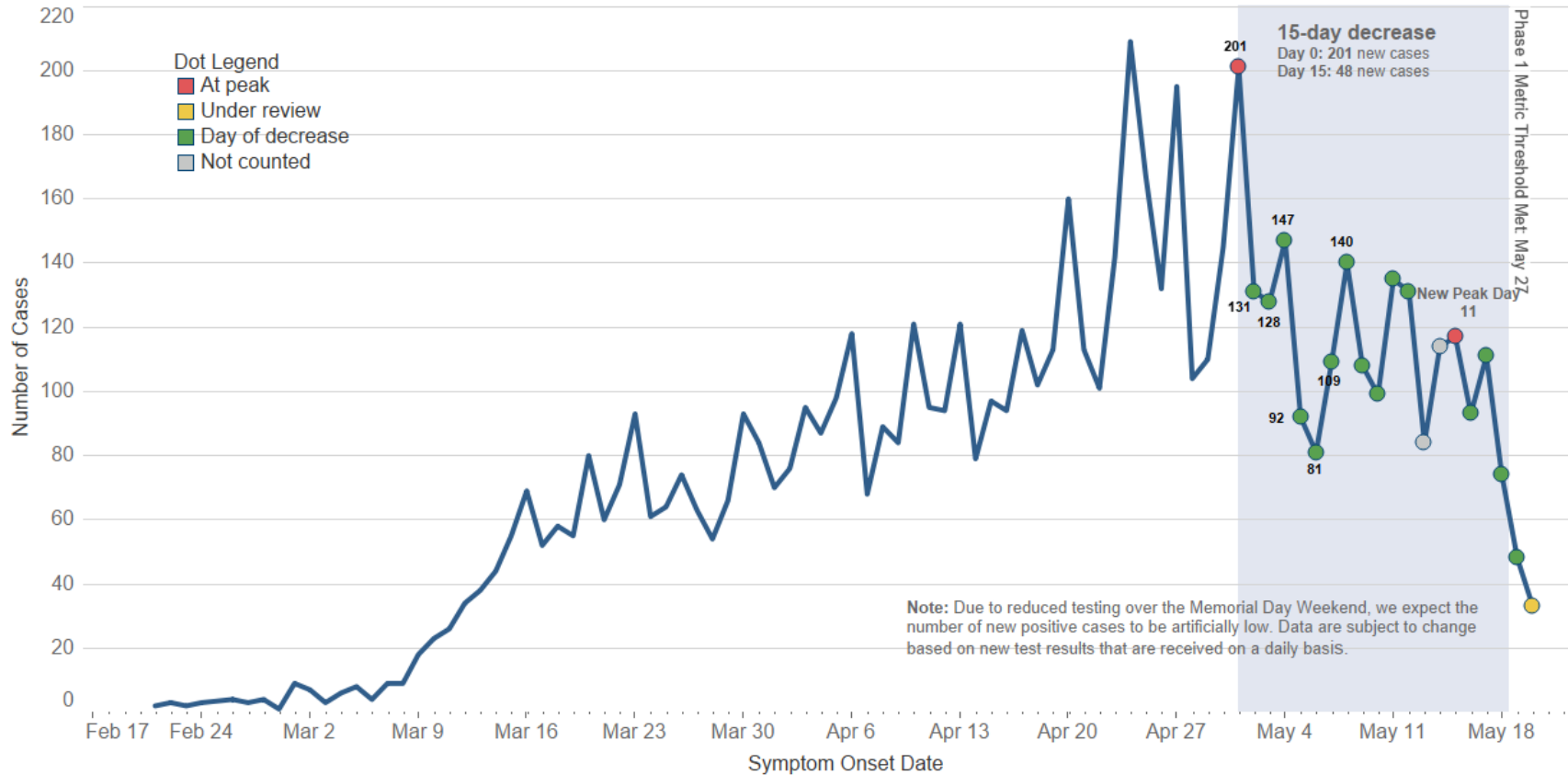

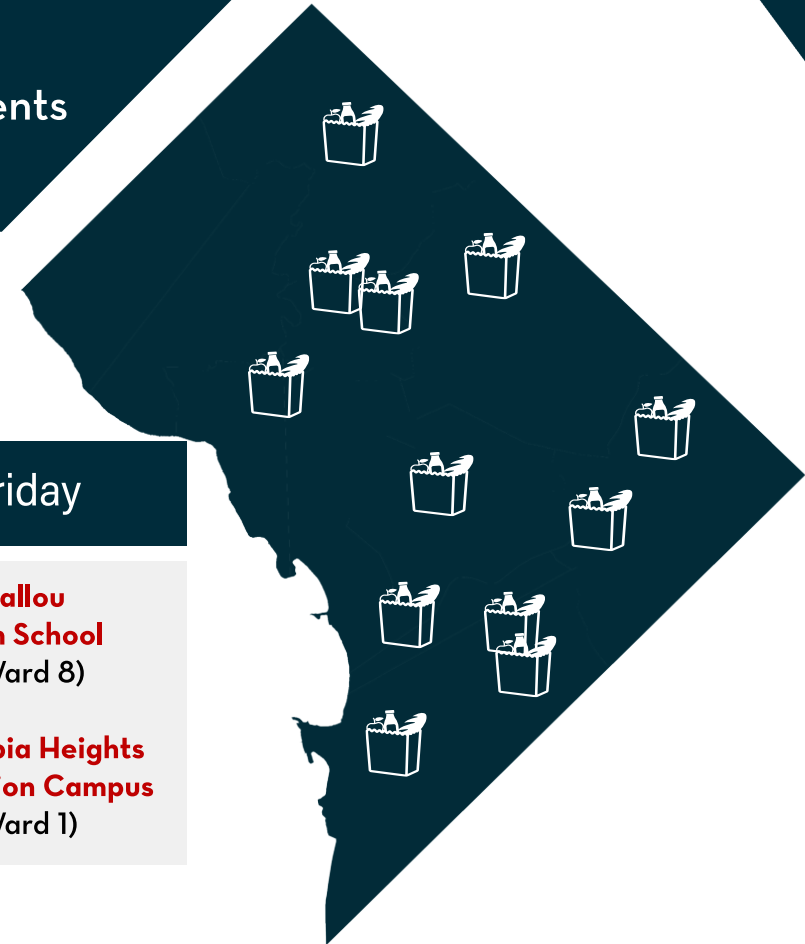
# New Grocery Sites

# 20 IS PLENTY

The default speed limit on local roads  
will be **20 miles per hour.**



Slows streets will support neighborhood-based social distancing by **limiting through traffic** and **lowering speeds** in areas with heavy foot and bicycle traffic.

Identified roads will be limited to local traffic only, meaning destinations within two blocks, and the **speed limit will be set at 15 mph.**



Restaurants that are **not already permitted for outdoor space** or that want to **expand their outdoor space**

Retailers may apply for space for **curbside pickup**

## WHAT TO KNOW

- Wear a mask (not required to wear while eating or drinking)
- All diners must be seated
- No more than six people at a table
- Tables must be six feet apart
- Games and other activities that lead to close contact are prohibited

- ✓ Rooftop seating
- ✓ Summer gardens

Alcohol can only be sold (except for grab and go or delivery) or consumed on-site between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and midnight.
